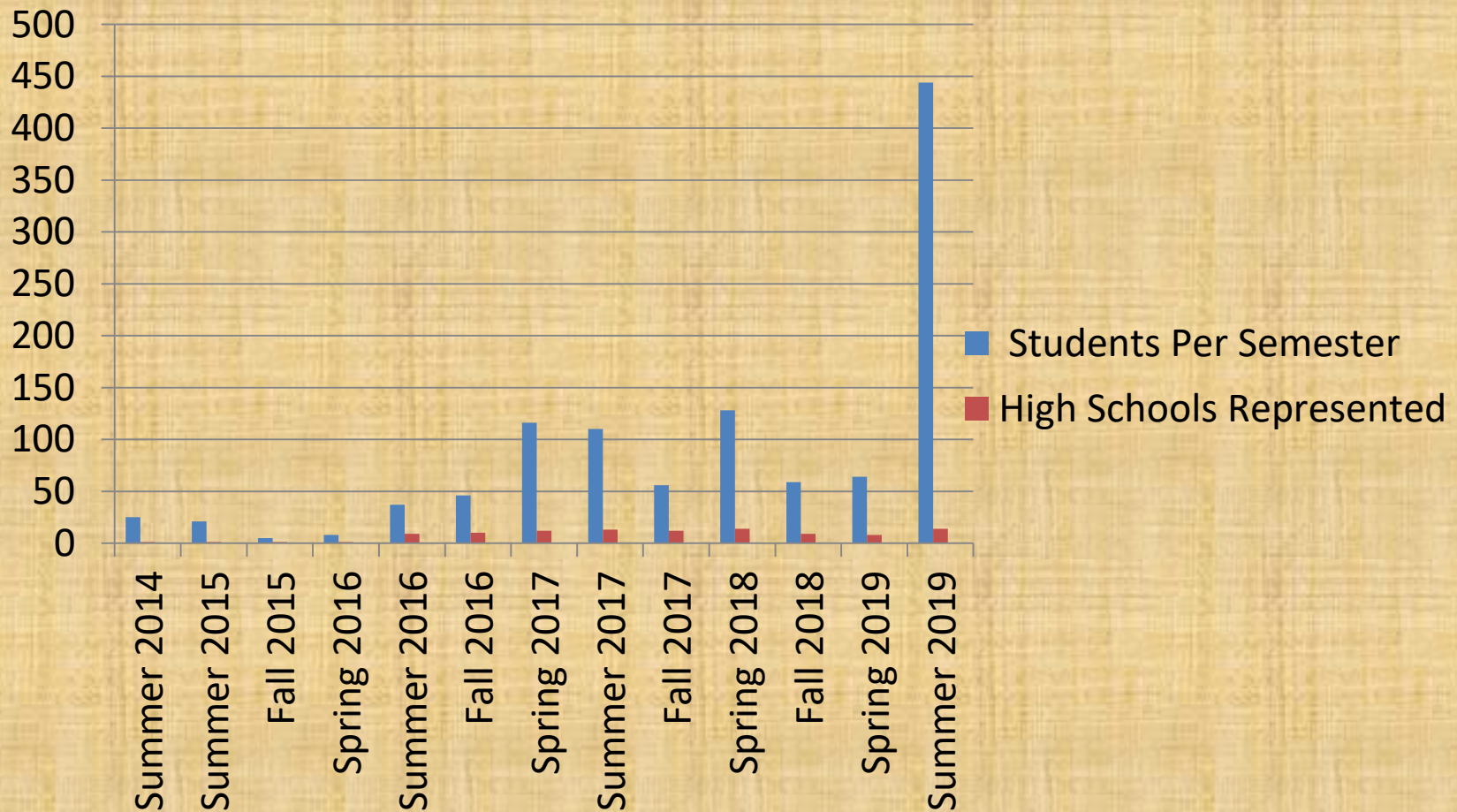
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Considerations for Successful Dual-enrollment to Community College to 4-year College Transfer

- Ensuring that coursework meets CSU/UC/IGETC transfer requirements (as appropriate)
- Allowing for changing careers and goals (versatile coursework)
- Regular access to academic counseling and educational planning
- Regular meetings with high school administrators, dual-enrollment team and counselors
- Shared or co-housed employees with K-12 school district and community college
- Monthly meetings of local IHE's - Institutions of Higher Education (in San Francisco, chaired by SFUSD staff, Sharon Zimmern) to share enrollment, transfer and recruitment strategies and challenges
- Community responsibility for CSET, CBEST and other test prep and testing requirements
- Dual-enrollment student tracking – from enrollment to transfer
- Shared vision for the development of future teachers “ Grow Your Own”
- Paid internships, paid fieldwork and linkages to school district, after-school, youth work and ECE jobs to keep students in school and employed

Career Changers

Preparing for Credential Programs

- CSET/CBEST/ Computer Skills Test Prep Classes
- Fieldwork courses in Elementary, Secondary, Early childhood Education
- Transitional Kindergarten Authorizations for current Multiple Subjects Holders
- Counseling and advising regarding courses required for credentials (out- of state, foreign degree holders, CSET exams, etc.)

Strategies for 4-year Partnerships

- Regular IHE Community Advisory meetings
- Knowing and holding school district and community college employment and labor market needs at the core
- K-12 SWP funding – opportunity to share transfer goals
- Guided Pathways, new funding formula and student success measures incentivize transfer
- Offer and fight for paid internships – jobs KEEP students in school
- Serve disproportionately impacted students intentionally
- Develop a community commitment to teacher development Offer courses and programs that allow for flexibility and shifting career goals flexibility around career goals and interests,
- Include 4 year colleges in regional joint venture meetings, shared grant applications and shared projects (NSF – STEM Teacher Development), Hispanic Serving Institutions, etc.

- Transfer Articulation Bridge courses (located at the community college)
- Advisory Committee representation
- Shared data MOU (in development)
- Liberal Studies /CAD ITEP Program (in Development) and ETPP Programs
- Math Science Teacher Initiative (MSTI) undergraduate partnership for STEM teachers
- Child and Adolescent Development Transfer Pathways (community funded GE courses) and Transfer Cohort
- METRO and PATH cohorts
