Currently, aspiring P-12 teachers who begin in a CA community college have only one statewide articulated EDUC course (C-ID EDUC 200) and two statewide transfer pathways (TMC in Elementary Education and Early Childhood Education) leading to a teaching career. The purpose of this session is to present an informed rationale to support a radically re-designed undergraduate experience that expands opportunities and includes future special education and single-subject future teachers. The information presented is intended to generate dialogue and discussion and provide a framework for a new model that can better support the undergraduate preparation of all P-12 teachers.

Dr. Marquita Grenot-Scheyer serves as Assistant Vice Chancellor, Educator Preparation and Public School Programs, for the California State University (CSU), Office of the Chancellor. She is responsible for leading, coordinating, and facilitating system wide efforts to recruit, prepare, and retain teachers, counselors, and school leaders for schools and communities. She represents the CSU at state and federal levels, providing policy and practice recommendations to ensure high quality educator preparation programs.

Prior to this appointment, she served as Dean of the College of Education at California State University, Long Beach. Dr. Grenot-Scheyer serves on the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC), the WestEd board, and was recently appointed (2018), to the board of directors for the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education (AACTE). She was

a member of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Teacher Education Task Force (2016) on Teacher Preparation, which produced the report, *Preparing teachers in today's challenging context*. She previously served two terms as a board member of the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP), (2013-17) and served as a commissioner, on the Commission on Standards and Performance Reporting for CAEP, (2012 to 2013). She earned her Ph.D. in Special Education from the joint doctoral program at the University of California, Los Angeles and California State University, Los Angeles. In recognition of her career accomplishments, she was selected as the Distinguished Alumnus, CSULA Charter College of Education, in 2008.

Claudia L. Martinez is the Executive Director for Educator Programs in the Office of Diversity and Engagement at the University of California, Office of the President (UCOP) where she provides systemwide support and guidance for UC's educator preparation and professional development programs, including the statewide California Subject Matter Project. She has held leadership positions at both UC Santa Barbara and at UC Merced managing a diverse portfolio of college-going initiatives focused on academic success and college access for underserved students. At UC Merced, she was one of the founding administrators for the university's

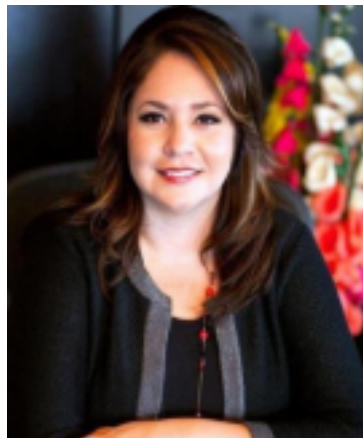
youngest campus. Throughout her career, Ms. Martinez has focused her work on issues of equity and access to K-12 and higher education, immigrant and civil rights, and civic engagement. She currently serves as the University of California's liaison to the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU), the national advocacy organization for Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSIs). In addition to her nearly twenty-four years of higher education experience, Ms. Martinez has worked for several policy and advocacy organizations including the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund (MALDEF), the National Association of Latino Elected and Appointed Officials (NALEO), the California Rural Legal Assistance Foundation and the Public Policy Institute of California (PPIC). She is an alumna of the Executive Leadership Academy at UC's Berkeley's Center for the Study of Higher Education and the Education Policy Fellows Program (EPFP) sponsored by the Institute for Educational Leadership. A native of Los Angeles, CA, Ms. Martinez received her Bachelors of Arts Degree in Law and Social Policy from UC Berkeley and her Master's Degree in Public Policy (M.P.P.) from UC Berkeley's Richard and Rhoda Goldman School of Public Policy (GSPP).



Sarah Neville-Morgan
Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction

In May 2019, Sarah Neville-Morgan was appointed by State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond to serve as the Deputy Superintendent for the Opportunities for All Branch (OFAB) at the California Department of Education (CDE). In this role, Neville-Morgan oversees a branch with a nearly \$10 billion budget and five divisions – Early Education, Expanded Learning, Multilingual Support, Nutrition Services, and Special Education. OFAB is responsible for helping all of California's 6.2 million students, from cradle to career, have access to quality preschool and afterschool programs, adequate access to nutritious meals, and quality inclusive public education that enhances their well-being, supports multi

lingual language development, and improves their educational potential. Prior to being named Deputy Superintendent, Neville-Morgan served as Director of CDE's Early Learning and Care Division and provided leadership to ensure high-quality early education programs for young children and their families. Previously, she served as Deputy Director of Program Management at First 5 California, as Deputy Executive Director of the California Early Learning Council, as an Academic Child Development Specialist at the UC Davis Center for Child and Family Studies, and also provided child development to foster care parents and worked in a child care resource and referral agency.

Sandra Sanchez brings over 20 years' experience in Economic and Workforce Development and Career Technical Education in higher education. Delaine Eastin
25th California State Superintendent of Public Instruction

As the first (and only) woman elected to be the Superintendent of Public Instruction (SPI) for the state of California, Eastin administered a department with more than 3300 people and was responsible for more than 40% of the state government's budget. She served as a Regent of the University of California and a Trustee at the California State University system. Prior to her election to two terms as SPI, she served 4 terms in the California State Assembly where she chaired the Education Committee and, prior to that, the Consumer Protection and Governmental Efficiency Committee. After two terms as state Superintendent, she was the first Executive Director of the National Institute for School Leadership (NISL). Subsequently, she was a Distinguished Visiting Professor of Educational Leadership at Mills College, where she also directed the Center for Civic Engagement and

Women's Leadership. Specialties: State and local government, education and educational leadership, transportation, the environment, children's health and nutrition, preschool and child development, garbage, recycling and food policy, planning and land use. An elementary school in Union City, a child development center in Fremont and an art gallery at Healdsburg High School were named in her honor.
