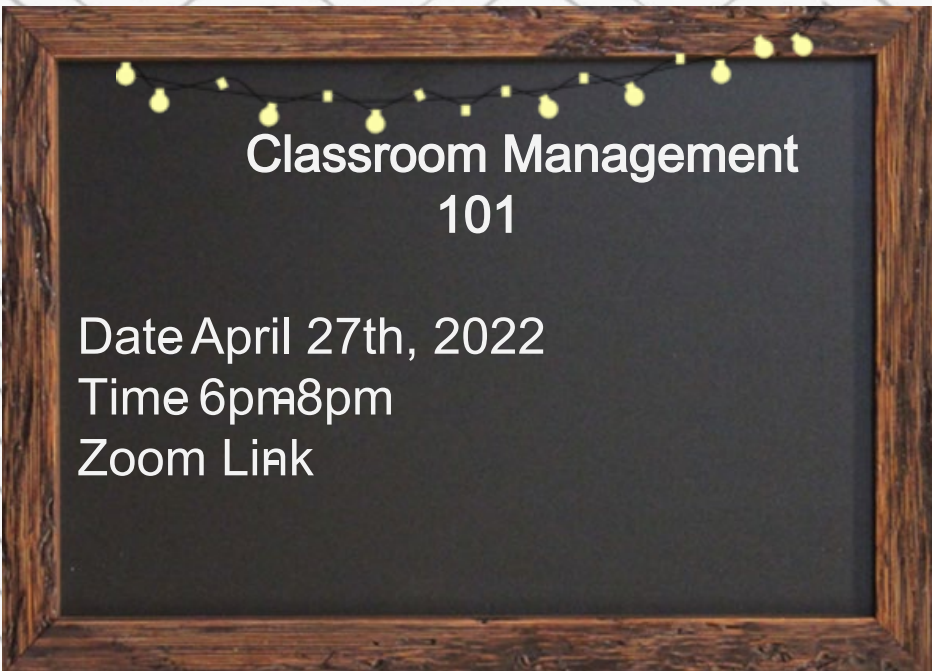

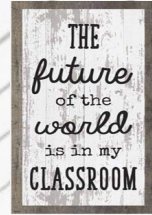


Classroom Management 101

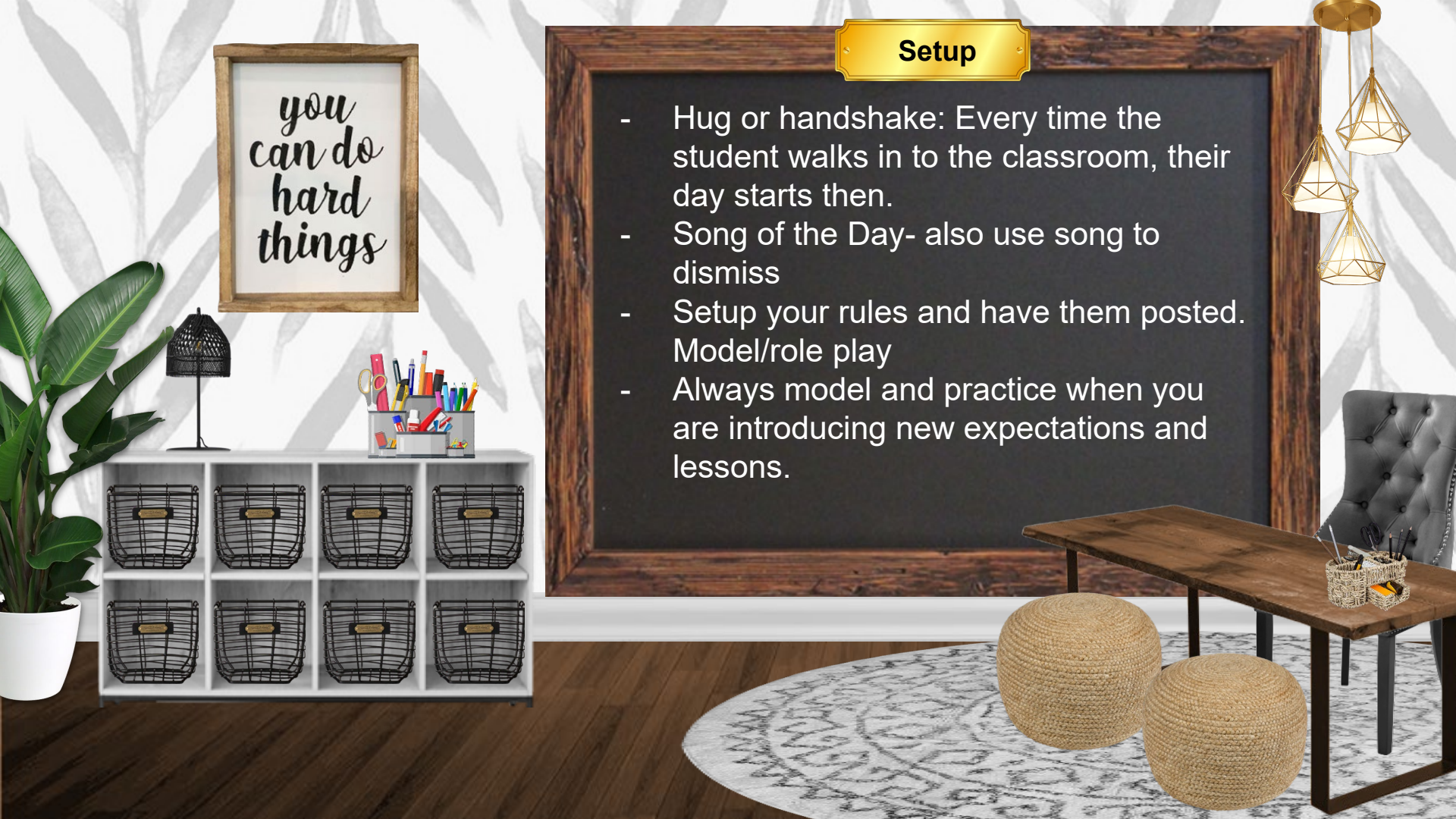

Setup

- Hug or handshake: Every time the student walks in to the classroom, their day starts then.
- Song of the Day- also use song to dismiss
- Setup your rules and have them posted. Model/role play
- Always model and practice when you are introducing new expectations and lessons.



Rewards

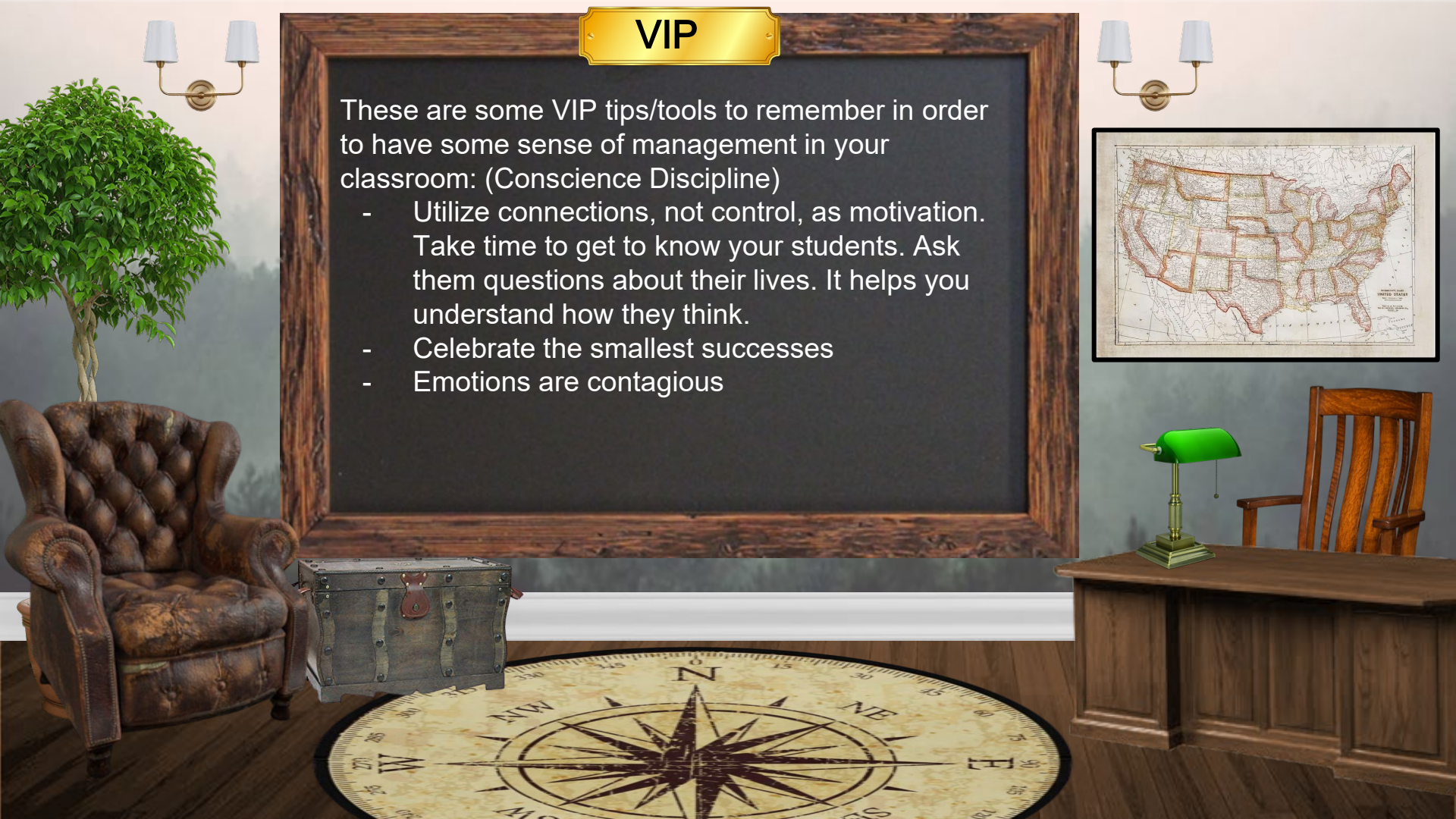
- Why behavior charts and sticker charts do not work for some students.
- Tickets, tickets, tickets
- Tickets are for everyone, and this will help alleviate you from repeating and raising your voice.
- Tickets for wrong answers. (side note explanation of how to attack wrong answers and make them positive)
- Tickets promote buy in
- How to use tickets at the end of the trimester
- When behavior charts could work

These are some VIP tips/tools to remember in order to have some sense of management in your classroom: (Conscience Discipline)

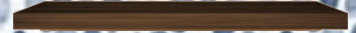
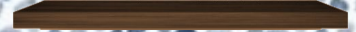
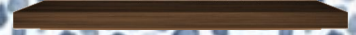
- Utilize connections, not control, as motivation. Take time to get to know your students. Ask them questions about their lives. It helps you understand how they think.
- Celebrate the smallest successes
- Emotions are contagious

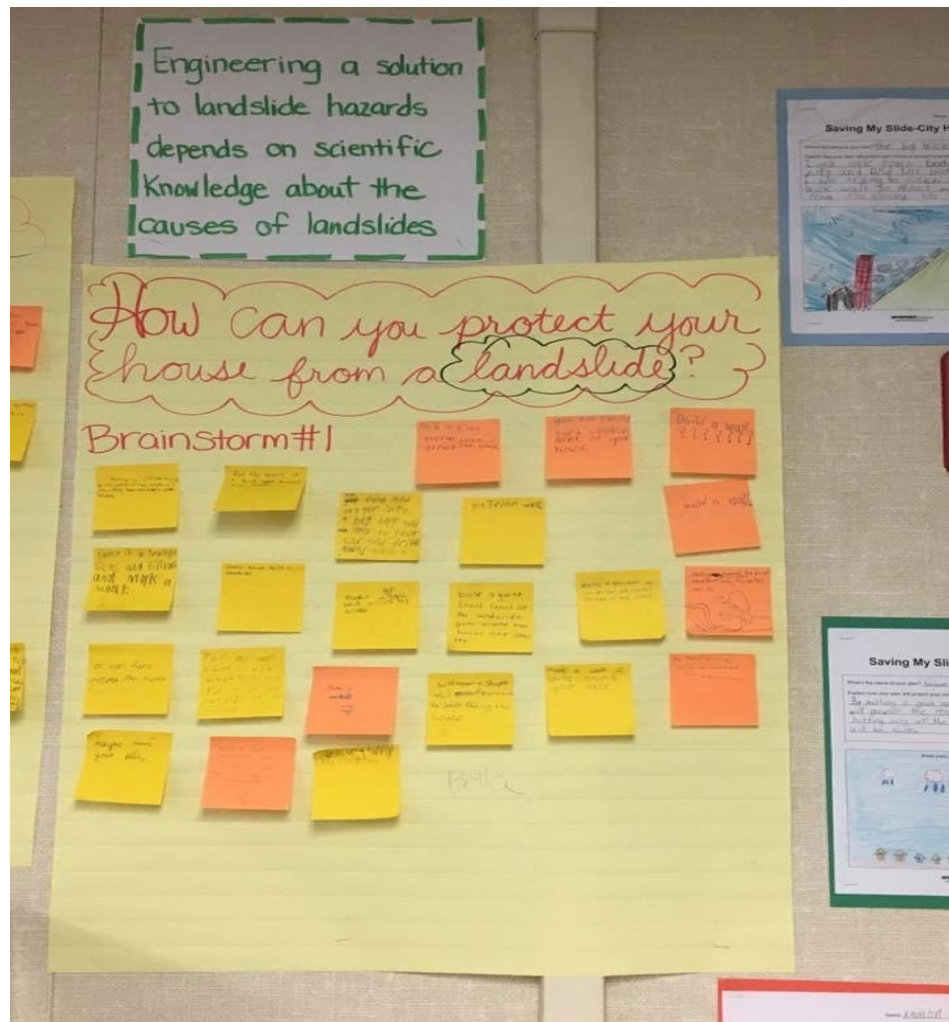
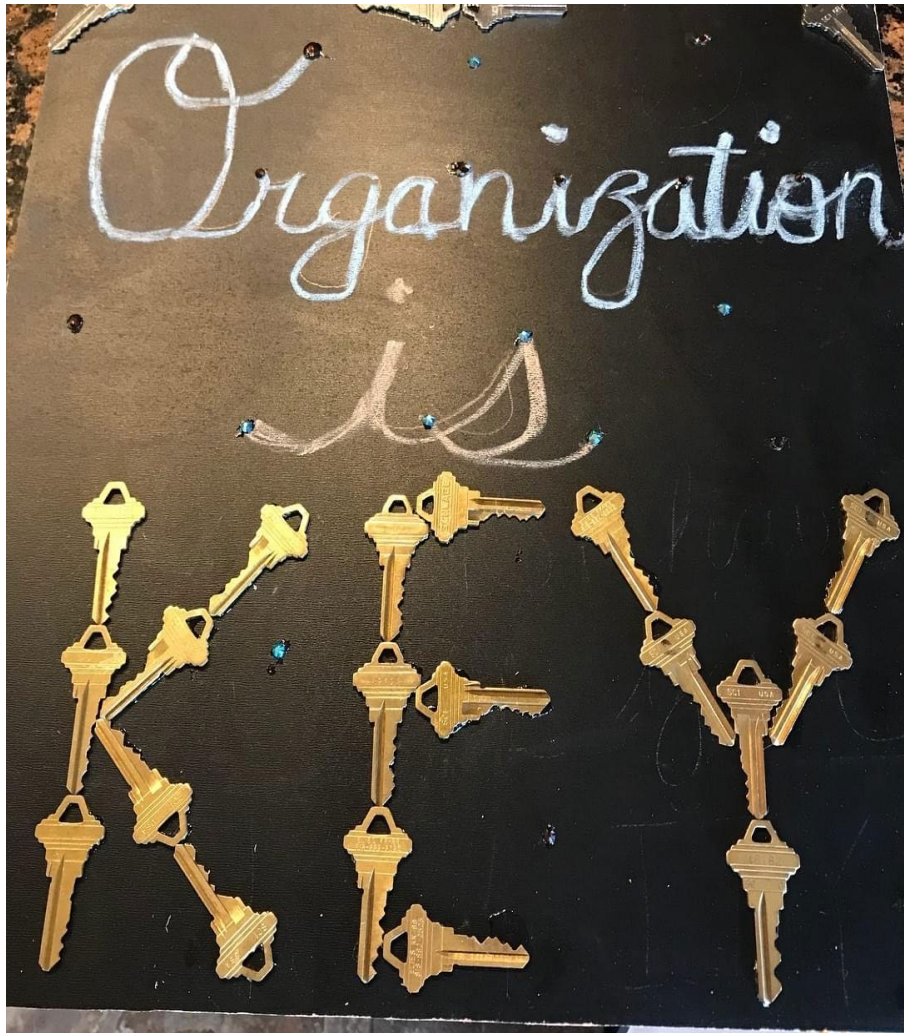
- Everything I, do I model. Never assume your student know what you expect. They always know what I expect.
- Set up a fun cue to get your student's attention. This cue helps in ANY setting.
- Be a lawyer. If you are having problems with a student, go through their CUM.
- When students finish their test, have them place their hands on their desk or complete extra credit.
- Call a test... "Show What You Know". This reduces anxiety.

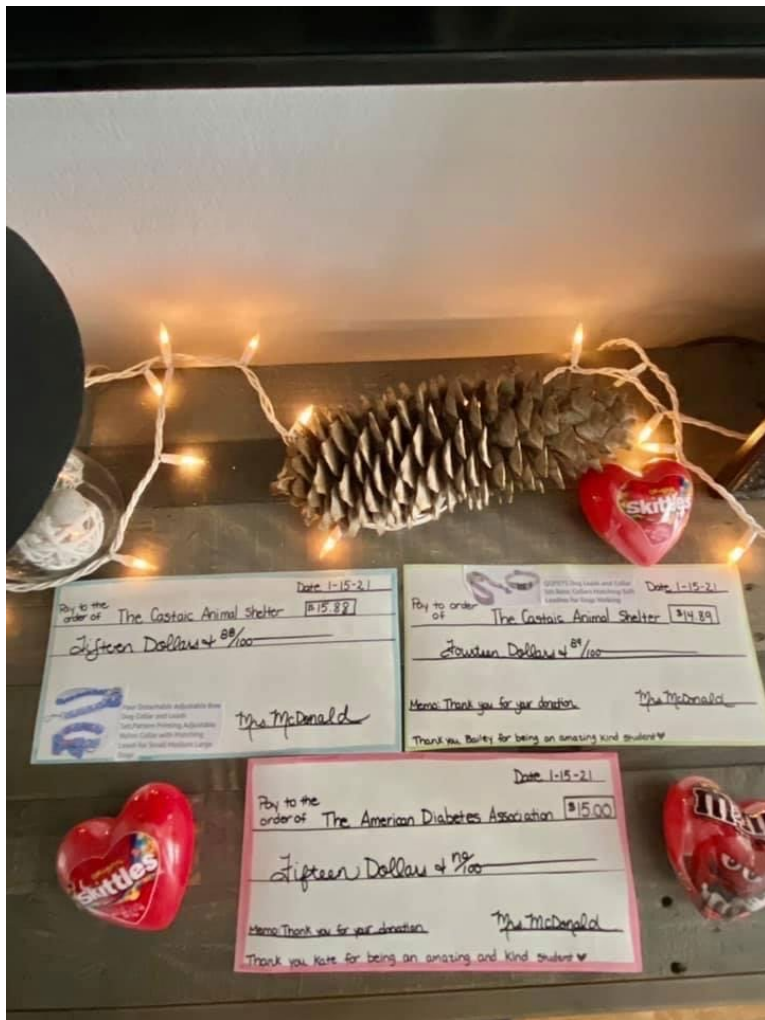


Tools, Tools and More Tools

- Organization is key! Model what you expect and give them time to organize.
- Only have what you need on your desk.
- Brain breaks- read your audience
- Parents: make sure you tell them that you are a team, set boundaries, let them know you have a life outside of school
- It takes 30 days to create a good or bad habit
- Have students sit up front with a clipboard. Not a punishment
- **EVERYONE IS UNIQUE** and has their own gift
